COURSE DETAILS

(A) General Nursing Midwifery (GNM)

The basic diploma course in general nursing and Midwifery is a 3 years' full time course in basic, adult, child and maternal health nursing, which is an institutional and community oriented.

(B) AFFILIATION

The GNM program is recognized by SNRC, affiliated to Goa Nursing Council (GNC) and is recognized by the Indian Nursing Council (INC).

(C) GNM ELIGIBILITY CRITERIA:

Minimum education eligibility criteria for admission to GNM:

- 10+2 with English and must have obtained a minimum of 40% at the qualifying examination in Science, Arts or Commerce from any recognized board. Candidates are also eligible from State Open School recognized by State Government and National Institute of Open School (NIOS) recognized by Central Government. However, Science is preferable.
- 10+2 with English having 40% of marks in vocational ANM course from the school recognized by Indian Nursing Council.
- 10+2 with English having 40% of marks in Vocational Stream-Health care Science from a recognized CBSE board/Centre.
- Registered ANM with Pass Mark.

RULES FOR ADMISSION

1. ONLINE APPLICATION

All eligible candidates must submit their application through the DHE Goa Samarth Portal at <https://goaadmission.samarth.ac.in> on or before the last date notified by the Directorate of Higher Education, Government of Goa. Candidates are required to upload scanned copies of all documents strictly as per the guidelines prescribed by DHE.

2. ADMISSION CONFIRMATION

Candidates selected in the merit list published on the college website must report in person to the College of Nursing for admission with original documents. The seat will be confirmed only upon payment of the prescribed academic fees within three (3) working days from the date of publication of the merit list. Failure to report within the stipulated period will result in cancellation of the allotted seat.

DOCUMENTS REQUIRED

- Certificate of Birth from the Registry.
- Certificate of Passing and statement of Marks of the 12th Std exam.
- School Leaving Certificate from the last school attended.
- Medical fitness certificate from the Government Doctor.
- Caste certificate from the competent authority in case the applicant is claiming for the reserved seats of SC/ST/OBC
- If an applicant has claimed admission under EWS, Income Certificate and Assets certificate from the Mamlatdar of concerned Taluka.
- In case of physically handicapped candidate, a certificate from the constituted Medical board of GMC hospital Bambolim, Hospicio Hospital Margao or North Goa District (Asilo) Hospital Mapusa, regarding the nature and the extent to which the candidate is fit for pursuing the diploma programme. (extent of disability should be 40% and above)
- Residence certificate
- Recent passport size photograph (4 no.)
- N.C.C. "C" Certificate if applicable.

EXAMINATION GUIDELINES

1. Shall have one regular examination followed by supplementary examination in a year.
2. If a candidate fails, they can be promoted to next year
3. A candidate can take any number of attempts with a condition that maximum period allowed is 6 years. However, all previous papers need to be cleared before appearing in the final examination
4. Minimum pass marks should be 50% in each of the Theory and practical paper separately.
5. Minimum pass marks shall be 40% for English only.
6. Theory and Practical exams for Introduction to Computer to be conducted as School exam and marks will be sent to the SNRC/ Board for inclusion in the mark sheet.
7. A candidate has to pass in theory and practical exam separately in each of the paper.
8. If a candidate fails in either theory or practical paper, he/she has to re-appear for both the papers (Theory and Practical)
9. Maximum number of candidates for practical examination will not exceed 20 per days.
10. All practical examination will be held in the respective clinical areas.
11. One internal and one external examiner jointly conduct practical examination for each student.

ELIGIBILITY FOR ADMISSION TO EXAMINATION

A candidate shall be eligible for the admission to the state Council / Board examination if the principal of the school certificate that:

- (a) She/ he has completed not less than eleven months of the course
- (b) A candidate must have minimum of 80% attendance (irrespective of the kind of absence) in theory and practical in each subject for appearing for examination.

The diploma shall not be awarded to the student till she / he has completed the clinical/field requirements.

- (c) A Candidate must secure 50% marks in internal assessment separately in each theory and practical.
- (d) The record of practical experience is complete.

CODE OF CONDUCT

Every student admitted to the Nursing course shall have to follow following rules and regulations of the Nursing College

- **DRESS CODE:**

The purpose of the dress code is to maintain high standard of decorum, hygiene and personal appearance, which are essential in caring patients, families and visitors. Therefore, the students are required to wear full uniform during college and clinical as per institutional rules. Using Lipsticks, Jewelry, finger rings, painted fingernails, long nails, tattoos, threads and bracelets on hands etc. are strictly not allowed. Students must be neat and tidy in their dress. Girls are allowed to wear small studded earring with hair covered with hair net. All students are allowed to wear a simple seconded wrist watch only.

- **PUNCTUALITY:**

Regular and punctual attendance in all class activities like lectures, demonstrations, practicals, clinical teaching, tutorials, tests etc is a must. Usual college time is 8:30 am – 4:00 pm and during clinical postings, 8 am – 4 pm. Students must have to participate in all college activities like clinical meetings, conferences, guest lectures, seminars as well as sports, cultural activities etc. Punctuality in theory and practical activities is most essential.

- **ATTENDANCE:**

Students are expected to attend all classes, both theory & practical. A minimum of 80% attendance in theory & 100% in practical is required to be eligible to appear for the GNC Board Examination. The student has to make up the shortfall in attendance at the end of program to attain 100% attendance in each of the practical components for each paper before the declaration of the result.

- **ABSENTEEISM:**

In case of absenteeism due to sickness or any emergency reason students are expected to inform class coordinator before or on the day of absenteeism through telephone and produce absenteeism notes from their parents before joining the classes. A medical certificate along with the absenteeism note should be produced for absence of 3 days or more. For planned leaves, students should ask prior permission from the Principal through coordinator by submitting a leave application. If a student is in need to get leave in the middle of a day due to any emergency need during college or hospital hours, she will be allowed to go only with concerned student's parent/ legal guardian after getting their application sanctioned by class coordinator and Principal.

- **GENERAL DISCIPLINE:**

Students shall refrain from defacing or damaging college property. In case of loss or damage, the College Authorities reserve the right to take disciplinary action and impose an exemplary penalty either individually or collectively to prevent recurrences. Students should maintain silence in the classes, library, reading room and in the corridors. A student nurse is not allowed to receive gift or gratuity of any sort at any time from the patients of the hospital or their relatives. If any student found in use of liquor or narcotics on hospital duty or in institute premises, he/she will be suspended from the institute for a specific period or be expelled from the institution.

- **CELL PHONES:**

Use of cell phone by students is strictly prohibited in class rooms, hospital and community.

- **ANTI - RAGGING**

We are committed in creating safe and secure environment and there is no place for RAGGING. Every student must refrain herself from participating in any form of Ragging themselves. Ragging is strictly prohibited in our institution as per the Goa Prohibition Act of ragging 2008: Goa Act of 2009 (Amendment) act 2010. Any student found guilty of Ragging is liable for punishment as per the direction of the Hon'ble Supreme Court. Students are required to maintain ethical and professional standards in behavior both inside and outside the college, hospital and community premises

- **LIBRARY AND LABORATORY**

Students can use library books following library procedures. If in case any book is lost or damaged, they will have to replace or pay the cost of the book. Similarly, during lab practice if any equipment is damaged, she will have to incur the loss. The students are expected to maintain silence in the Library and Laboratory.

- **STUDENT NURSES ASSOCIATION**

Membership in the Student Nurses' Association is compulsory. Students are expected to actively participate in local, state and National level activities conducted by the SNA and NSS.

- **PTA MEETING**

Parents/guardians will be updated about Student's progress and academic performance through PTA meeting which will be conducted twice a year.

- **TRANSPORT FACILITY**

Transport will be provided to the students during clinical postings.

- **FEES PAYMENT**

The student must clear all the dues of the college fee before the commencement of exam; otherwise she will not be allowed to attend the exams

- **VACATION**

Students will have public holidays and vacation of total 4 weeks distributed over year.

- **MISCELLANEOUS**

Terms set forth are subject to alterations, additions and variation as may be made from time to time by the College authorities whenever they may deem it expedient or necessary or in order to comply with Board/Council/University requirement.
